

PROGRAM EVALUATIONS

Students have access to SU Online and are expected to know how to comprehend their degree audits. On SU Online, the degree audit is called "Program Evaluation" and is listed under the student menu. A Program Evaluation is a computer-generated report that enables the student and his/her advisor to assess the student's academic progress and unfulfilled degree requirements. The audit is a valuable tool for academic planning and course selection because it matches the courses that the student has taken with the requirements of his/her degree program.

How to Read an Undergraduate Program Evaluation

Student and Program Information – Student profile and academic information are listed at the top of the Program Evaluation. If students are pursuing more than one degree, they will have a separate program evaluation for each degree. Students pursuing double majors will have their secondary major requirements included within their primary degree's program evaluation.
