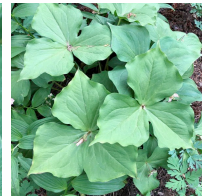

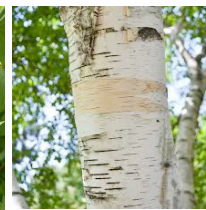
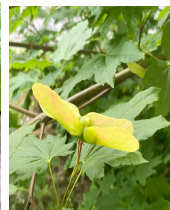
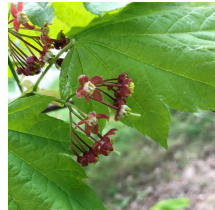
Beach shells, clam, oyster, mussel
